Introduction

B PERMIT

These are the requirements for B Permit which is in essence a student Visa. There are different requirements for students applying from inside the EU and students applying from outside the EU. As a non EU student you must provide proof of funds to cover living expenses. You must apply for a visa with the Swiss authorities in your country of residence before coming to Switzerland. You must duly complete and return **a form E** with required attachments to the following address:

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

We recommend that you open a bank account as soon as you get your student B permit. Documents required for opening a Swiss bank account:

- Passport
- Proof of enrolment
- Student B permit

Geneva Business School students can open a bank account at any bank. We highly recommend the UBS branch near campus.

Getting to Geneva

OPTION 1:



Airport public transport

Students planning to use the public transportation system to go from Geneva Airport to Geneva city center can get a free ticket near the exit of the luggage claim area.

- **From the airport to the city center:** You can get to the railway station directly from the arrivals and check-in area at Geneva airport. A seven-minute train ride takes you to the central railway station (Gare de Genève-Cornavin).

OPTION 2:



- **From the airport to downtown Geneva:** The buses 5 and 10 will take you downtown. Bus stops are located at the departure level of Geneva Airport.

OPTION 3:



Taxi

Taxis in Geneva can be ordered by phone on **+41 22 33 141 33**, hailed in the street or found at about 60 authorised taxi ranks in town, notably at the airport and at the main station. Fares between the airport and the city center range from about **CHF 35 to CHF 60** depending on traffic, time and number of passengers. **Uber** also operates in Geneva and the prices may be more affordable.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Here are two companies that you will quickly get familiar with:

- The train company in Switzerland is called “CFF” (cff.ch).
- The buses in Geneva are handled by “TPG” (tpg.ch).

Geneva Transport Day Card: This travel card gives you freedom of travel for one day in Geneva, using any type of public transport (bus, boat or tram), for CHF 10. A single ticket costs CHF 3, and is valid for one hour in Zone 10. A CFF Half Fare Travelcard offers reduced prices for public transport.

The Lemman Express:

The Lemman Express will take you directly to campus - Secheron station. From there you can reach town, and several French stations neighbouring Geneva from Thonon to Annecy.

Unireso Monthly Pass:

The monthly cost of a Geneva Public Transport (TPG) Pass, covering Zone 10, is CHF 75 for adults and CHF 45 for young people (25 or younger). Zone 10 covers the city of Geneva, including the airport, and gives you unlimited access to bus, tram, and boat.


You can subscribe for a monthly pass at any TPG point of sale, by providing a copy of your ID, your address in Geneva, and a Swiss phone number. The annual pass can also be a good option for CHF 400 (under 25) or CHF 500.

Yellow shuttle boats called “Les Mouettes”, or “seagulls”, cross the lake and take you from one side of Geneva to another, every 10 minutes between 07:00 and 18:00. Buy single-ride tickets from machines on the dock (CHF 2-3), or use any valid TPG bus ticket

BIKE

*Genève*roule!

From April to October, free bikes are available for up to four hours at Genèveroule, just outside the train station. Simply show your photo ID and leave a CHF 20 cash deposit. The rest of the year, Genèveroule rents out bikes from CHF 12 per day. A second office, known as Terrassière, is located at Ruelle des Templiers 4 in the Eaux-Vives neighborhood (left bank).


CITY CENTER



Extending from the financial district to Eaux-Vives, the parallel streets of Rue du Rhône and Rue du Marché (and Rue de Rive further east) constitute Geneva's most famous shopping district. Designer retail stores and world-famous watchmakers line streets packed with window shoppers, turning it into an impromptu fashion catwalk.

RUE DU MONT BLANC



Although not as fashionable as the city center, there is an equally large selection of clothing and jewellery on display along Rue du Mont Blanc and its surrounding streets. This is also the best area in the city to pick up souvenirs such as Swiss Army knives, chocolates and other Swiss knick-knacks.

THE OLD TOWN



If you're looking for art or antiques, the Old Town (Vieille Ville) is the place for you. The Grand Rue is the primary shopping street but don't be afraid to get lost in one of the Old Town's many winding alleys, where every turn promises a new surprise. Many antique shops feel like real museums, filled with relics dating back to Geneva's medieval days.

CAROUGE



Located on the left bank of Geneva, this lovely neighborhood will offer you plenty of treasures among its shops, restaurants, and bars. Take a stroll in its street and appreciate the classic architecture of the small, quaint buildings, eat a Gelato on the “Place du Marché” or have a tasty tapas assortment with a sip of wine on a terrace. In Carouge, you’ll discover new spots and a warm atmosphere in what we call “the city in the city”.

CENTRE BALEXERT



The largest and best mall in Geneva with over 110 stores including designer outlets, a grocery store and a movie theater. In Balexert, students can find everything they need for their day-to-day life.
